FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

What is the Postgraduate Qualifying Program?

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program is a non-award program for students who do not meet the direct academic entry requirements into postgraduate courses in Business Administration (leading to our MBA); Business Analytics (leading to our Master of Business Analytics Extension); and Accounting (leading to our Master of Accounting and Master of Professional Accounting).

Successful completion of the Postgraduate Qualifying Program grants entry into the following Kaplan Business School courses:

Most students who enrol into the Postgraduate Qualifying Program will apply for the following pathway:

Postgraduate Qualifying Program > Graduate Certificate > Master's

How many subjects does the Postgraduate Qualifying Program consist of?

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program consists of 5 core subjects:

What are the academic and English requirements into the Postgraduate Qualifying Program?

The academic and English requirements are as follows:

- Academic: Successful completion of an Australian Advanced Diploma or Associate Degree or equivalent offshore qualification
- English: IELTS of 5.5 or equivalent

Students who do not meet both the academic and English requirements may still be considered for entry based on a minimum of 2 years work experience.

What are the 2021 tuition fees for the Postgraduate Qualifying Program?

- International student fees: AUD\$1,500 per subject - AUD\$7,500 full program
- Domestic student fees: AUD\$1,200 per subject - AUD\$6,000 full program

Note: FEE-HELP is not available for this course.

Are scholarships available?

How is the Postgraduate Qualifying Program delivered?

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program is available at any of the five Kaplan Business School campuses (Adelaide, Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney). A 100% online study option is available to eligible students in Trimester 1 and Trimester 2, 2021.

The duration of the Postgraduate Qualifying Program is 1 trimester (12 weeks).

For classroom delivery, students are required to attend one 4.5-hour class (with a 30min break) for 5 days each week over the 12-week period. In relation to students on a student visa, this amounts to 20 hours per week which is in line with the National Code 2018. The maximum class size will be 25 students.

For online delivery, students are required to attend two by 2-hour sessions for 5 days each week over the 12-week period. In relation to students on a student visa, this amounts to 20 hours per week which is in line with the National Code 2018.

Does completion of the Postgraduate Qualifying Program enable students to be eligible for entry to another Australian education provider?

The sole purpose of the Postgraduate Qualifying Program is to enable students to meet the entry requirements into a Kaplan Business School graduate certificate course. However, a student may apply for entry to another education provider who may determine eligibility on a case-by-case basis. Kaplan Business School cannot facilitate that process with another provider.

Can students apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) into the Postgraduate Qualifying Program based on previous studies (undertaken in Australia or offshore)?

Some students may be eligible to receive RPL for *PQP001 Academic English* and *PQP005 Intercultural Studies* based on the following:

- If the student was born in Australia
- If the student has undertaken sufficient studies within the Australian Education System
- If the student has completed an offshore qualification that was taught in English

Each request for RPL of these subjects will be assessed case-by-case. Students may be requested to provide further evidence in support of their RPL request.

What is important about the Postgraduate Qualifying Program being a non-award course?

Students will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) on accepting their Offer of Admission which can be used to apply for an international student visa if required. On completion of the course, however, they will not receive a Testamur. The course is not credit-bearing – that is, students cannot receive any RPL for entry into another Kaplan Business School course.

Can students study *only* the Postgraduate Qualifying Program, or do they need to package it with another course?

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program can be taken as a standalone program. However, the premise is that it will be used to progress to a graduate certificate course and ultimately a master's course.

Can students transfer to another Kaplan Business School campus after completing the Postgraduate Qualifying Program?

Yes, Postgraduate Qualifying Program students can transfer between Kaplan Business School campuses, subject to certain conditions applicable to any request for a campus transfer and to state and national regulations on border closures during the pandemic.

Is this course recognised by the Australian Government?

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program is fully recognised by the Australian Government and is registered on the Study in Australia website. The CRICOS Course code is **102708D**.

If a student's English level is below the entry requirement, can he/she be offered an English for Academic Purposes pathway with Kaplan International Languages prior to commencing his/her course?

If a student completes the Postgraduate Qualifying Program online and wishes to study the Graduate Certificate on campus, can they defer enrolment until they are able to travel to Australia?

Yes, subject to Kaplan Business School procedure on granting deferrals. As always, students will need to seek their own advice on how this may impact visa requirements.

What support do students receive?

As with all Kaplan Business School courses, the Postgraduate Qualifying Program offers its full range of Kaplan Business School's award-winning student experience services including additional support in developing students' English and academic study skills; outstanding career prospects and outstanding graduate outcomes (for those who successfully complete the master's program).

Does the Postgraduate Qualifying Program count towards the requirements for Post Study Work (PSW)?

As always, students need to obtain their own visa advice. It can be noted that the Postgraduate Qualifying Program is a non-award course. However, after completion of the master's, students may be eligible for PSW.
